CYBER-CRIME AND FRAUD – THE FACTS

- 7 MILLION offences (fraud and computer mis-use) (54% of all crime!)
- Computer misuse up 47%! (1.869million)
- 9% of adults victim of fraud

Source: CSEW 2021

- 39% of businesses suffered at least one attack in past 12 months
 - 65% of medium and large businesses...
- 27% of businesses targeted suffered at least once a week
- 31% have a business continuity plan
- Phishing most common type of attack 83%
- 43% of businesses have cyber insurance (up 11%) but only 6% have a dedicated cyber policy


